We were also pleased to welcome to Spay-Ghetti so many friends who have assisted so generously with our ongoing Malamute Rescue effort. Lisa Fairman (creator of Malamute Munchies), Rock Hand Hardware staff, Lewis & Clark Brewing Company, officials from Jefferson County law enforcement, folks from the Malamute Rescue league, veterinarians Jillian Dougherty and Julie Kappes, and our colleagues at the Humane Society of the United States. who are in need of a caring friend.


I encourage every person to come and volunteer; it's such a great opportunity for animal lovers throughout Helena and the surrounding area!

GET A WHIFF OF THIS: A DOG'S NOSE IS ITS NEWSPAPER

What if you could tell what's for dinner before getting out of the car? What if you knew your neighbor was home before knocking on the door? What if you could smell someone's fear or anger? What if your nose was as good as your dog's?

A dog's nose dominates its face and its brain, and therefore its world. In the realm of smell, a dog's olfactory skills far surpass a human's. When a human smells something, he may detect an odor. When a dog smells something, it gets a story.

How is this possible? Simply put, their brains are wired for it. The average-sized dog's olfactory bulbs, or scent receptors, are

four times larger than a human's, even though the dog's brain is only about 1/10 the size of a human's. The portion of a dog's brain directed as processing smells is over 40 greater than a human's, and it's estimated a dog can identify smells between 1,000 and 10,000 times better than a human.

The size of a dog's nose is important. Dogs with longer snouts have more scent receptors and therefore greater scenting abilities. A bloodhound, the champion of sniffing, has about 300 million

scent receptors, a dachshund has around 125 million, and a human only 5 million.

Because dogs are hunters, their noses are tuned to animal-related odors. Animals secrete pheromones, odorous chemicals designed to transmit information to other animals. These chemicals contain a wealth of information for dogs, including an animal's age, health, sex, and yes, even an animal's emotional state. Dogs spread pheromones by rubbing up against things.

Pheromones are also contained in a dog's urine. The tree your dog pees on contains a wealth of information and gives other dogs sniffing it a tabloid full of the latest news in the dog world. When Fido contorts his body like a yoga master to pee on a vertical surface, he's not being a masochist, he's merely trying to get the scent higher so it's more discernible and the air can carry it farther.

Butt sniffing is also popular in the canine world, in a practical sort of way. A dog's rear end has a wealth of information, as there will be traces of pheromones, feces, urine, and any sexual activity. Dogs process this information almost instantly and use it for social purposes. Don't be embarrassed when a dog sniffs

your crotch, it's getting the same information as in butt sniffing, and it won't tell others what it smells.

What I find amazing is scientific research showing dogs can separate smells into individual, recognizable odors. If you or I walk into a kitchen where a pot of stew is brewing, we can probably pick up a scent or two and determine that stew is cooking. A dog can walk in and discriminate all the individual stew ingredients in the pot.

Human's have long recognized the superior sniffing abilities of canines and have put them to good use. Search and rescue dogs do fantastic things locating missing persons, dead or alive, on land or in water. They also sniff for bombs,

locate drugs, detect cancer, and predict seizures.

Tracking dogs follow the scent of footsteps on the ground, and can follow a track that is days old. A good tracking dog can follow a human path that is days or even weeks old, even though other people have passed over the same trail.

Trailing dogs sniff the air and follow a scent from skin cells called "rafts" that carry a person's odor and fall from the human body like snowflakes at a rate of about 50 million cells per minute.

They can therefore follow a human whose feet have not touched the ground. Bloodhounds are the champions of trailing. Their keen memories allow them to follow a trail all day without a single scent reminder.

Human remains detection dogs can even detect the scent of humans buried near the root structures of trees. They may alert by putting their paws on the relevant tree, which is emitting human odors as part of its photosynthesis and other biological processes.

A dog's nose is its news. Don't sell a dog short when it comes to the world of scent. They are the masters. A dog should be allowed to use its nose at least some of the time on a walk with its human companion. It's good stimulation. To deprive a dog of smelling during a walk would be like making a person take an evening walk blindfolded.

So, fret not if Rover gets preoccupied with smelling and peeing on a walk, he's doing very important things. Fret only that he can't tell you the story he's getting and leaving by sniffing, squatting, and rubbing—his unique ways of communicating and understanding his world.

HAPPY ENDINGS: Stanley the Ambassador Cat


Meet Stanley, the adopted cat of Lisa Hudecek. Stanley and Lisa first met when Stanley was just 7 months old when she came to the shelter to adopt a cat after her prior cat was lost during a car accident. Apparently Stanley had been turned in by prior owners who thought that he was just too much of a kitten for them. So back to the shelter he came.

When Lisa entered the pet room, "Stanley was tearing around the room like a maniac." she remembers. "Finally, he stopped running, came around and just sat down right in front of me. That's when I knew he was supposed to be mine!"

Even though Lisa had other cats, Stanley became the king of the house immediately upon arriving at her home. "He was very outgoing, "Lisa said. "He fit in right away."

On a whim Lisa decided to take him to PetCo in Great Falls for a Halloween photo. "I was amazed—he was so laid back, just sitting back, enjoying all the attention and completely chill. He thinks everyone is there to serve him. Everyone at PetCo fell in love with him. That's when I knew he was something special."

Lisa realized Stanley had bigger things in store for him. She works with a local rescue in



From there, they began going to schools to teach kids about the importance of spaying and neutering your animal. "Stanley is always like, 'Tada I'm here!' He loves the harness—he knows that means it's time to go to work. He will let anyone pet him. He's a great ambassador for shelter cats and for the human-animal bond. Stanley shows people how loveable and accessible shelter cats are. It's been an amazing gift to be able to bring him into the community and show him off."

For his work in the community, Stanley was recently nominated by Great Falls' Animal Foundation for the Purple Paw Award which honors an animal who's

helped expand the knowledge of human animal bond.

The photos that accompany this article are from a professional photo shoot by Photo Solutions that Stanley took part in. Lisa says, "Not surprisingly, he was a total ham for the camera. Nothing fazes him" She turned the photos into a calendar for a friend. Stanley has his own Facebook page ("Stanley cat's pet page") where he announces various things that are going on in Great Falls and gives pet care tips. Lisa reports most of his "friends" are kids from the schools he's gone to visit. Recently, Stanley's been trekking to a nursing home in Livingston to visit Lisa's dad.
