Malamute trial ends in conviction

To the great relief to thousands of people who became compelled by the case of the abused Malamutes rescued by LCHS, the defendant was found guilty in late October of all 91 counts of animal abuse. At this writing, sentencing is set for early November. The dogs, who have been cared for by LCHS staff for over a year, will be adopted out shortly, finally able to find their “forever homes.”

The trial of puppy mill owner Mike Chilinski lasted four days and the jury deliberated for just a few hours before delivering their “guilty” verdicts. Mr. Chilinski was remanded into custody that day.

Thousands of people in America, Canada and abroad were moved to donate money, food, toys and time to help the dogs, many of whom were sick, injured and grossly underweight when LCHS staff, personnel from the Humane Society of the United States and Jefferson County law first brought the dogs to the shelter. Local businesses hosted fundraisers, people volunteered hundreds of hours, and animal



lovers from across the globe sent messages of support. Under the care and supervision of the staff of LCHS and veterinarians, the dogs were slowly brought back to health and are ready to find a home. I also must thank our incredible volunteers who have donated hundreds of hours to care for the cats, walk dogs, help with fundraisers, assist with Spay Montana clinics, serve as foster parents to youngsters and serve as ambassadors in the community throughout weekly Outreach program. The malamute rescue took a lot of time and



effort, but we still had to carry on with sheltering thousands of other animals, too – our volunteers allowed us to juggle the demands with efficiency and compassion.

I hope that ALL of you know how much we appreciate your love for animals, and share in our desire that 2013 is a banner year for everyone – two and four legged. 🐾

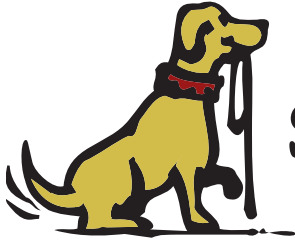
